

Community Development Officers, also known as Community Liaison Officers or Place-based Coordinators, play a vital role in fostering community engagement and development, ensuring that local initiatives are effectively implemented to enhance community well-being.

Key tasks include collaborating with local residents and organisations to identify community needs, developing and implementing community development plans, facilitating community meetings and workshops, liaising with local government and other stakeholders, advocating for community interests, and evaluating the impact of community programs.
